8. Public comments regarding issues not in this agenda/suggested agenda items for future meetings

The Board opened the floor for public comments.

9. Chief Executive Officer's Report

Mr. Netanel started by recognizing the hard work and dedication of Ms. May and Ms. LaFlamme with the process of getting the new database up and running.

Mr. Netanel stated that one of CAMTC's top priorities is to continue to work with local government agencies.

Mr. Netanel stated that he was not yet comfortable with original deadline of October 1, 2016 for the new database and it would be postponed to November 1, 2016.

Mr. Netanel stated many expired certificate holders have taken advantage of the limited recertification program. CAMTC has sent out more than 10,000 flyers to those that qualified, as well as a mass e-blast and will do so again before the end of the year.

Application turnaround time for an application from the time it is complete to the time it is approved is 23 days and may be quicker when new database is up and running. Mr. Netanel stated CAMTC will have to be cautious that all cities and counties have enough time to give CAMTC any information that may affect the approval of an application.

Mr. Netanel presented the Human Trafficking brochure and the Board went into open discussion and provided additional input.

10. School Presentations

Mr. McElroy stated law enforcement initially contacted CAMTC about arrests made in massage establishments. After continued training, Mr. McElroy has seen an increase in confidence and PSD is now receiving citations and notifications.

14. Director of ESD's report

Mr. Smith stated that school approval process has launched and ESD is continuing to receive new school applications.

Chairman Dixon reconvened the meeting (which began on 9/28/16) at 8:34am on Thursday, September 29, 2016.

Mr. Dixon suspended the rules of debate and the Board went into an extensive discussion with input from all Board members and the public.

1. 2017 strategic priorities

1. Schools - In light of the recent closure of several major private colleges and the implementation of CAMTC's school approval program, there is concern about adequate opportunities for quality training in therapeutic massage. CAMTC will evaluate the potential impact of these developments on the profession and the public and explore CAMTC's role in fostering broad accessibility to massage education throughout the state.

- 2. Accountability To ensure that CAMTC and its stakeholders can review CAMTC's progress in meeting its public protection mission, CAMTC will regularly track and publicly post on the website its disciplinary performance measures.
- 3. Local Government Relationships CAMTC will continue to support and collaborate with cities and counties by providing education on CAMTC's certification, school approval program, and the use of revocable registration. CAMTC will continue to build a positive relationship with the League of California Cities and California State Association of Counties. CAMTC will track and report to the Legislature how well cities comply with their legal responsibility to impose and enforce only reasonable and necessary fees and regulations on massage businesses and massage establishments, in keeping with the requirements of existing law and mindful of the need to protect legitimate business owners and massage professionals, particularly sole providers.
- 4. Businesses Build a comprehensive database of massage establishments and spa owners in order to provide outreach and communication with this important group of stakeholders.
